
# HIGHLIGHTS

Founded in 1546 by King Henry VIII, Christ
Church College is one of Oxford's largest
colleges and with a number of
architecturally significant buildings
including Tom Quad, the largest
quadrangle in Oxford, and the Great
Dining Hall

# THE ASHMOLEAN MUSEUM OF ART AND ARCHAEOLOGY

Explore the world's oldest public museum, founded by Elias Ashmole in 1677, with a rooftop restaurant.





## LONDON - OXFORD



1 HR 15 MINS

Hop on an early train out of London towards Oxford, and spend the morning exploring this stunning University town. Be sure to leave time to explore Christ Church Cathedral.

Grab a bite of lunch at one of the many traditional English pubs in Oxford.

This afternoon, visit The Ashmolean Museum of Art and Archaeology, or take time to enjoy a punt on the river

Corpus Christi College —look for two charming tortoises, named after the college founders — Fox and Oldham



New College – built in 1379 as a miniature version of Windsor Castle

# HIGHLIGHTS

#### **BLENHEIM PALACE**

Blenheim Palace is Britain's greatest palace and the birthplace of Sir Winston Churchill. A masterpiece of Baroque architecture, **Blenheim Palace** provides an awe-inspiring experience for visitors

#### **BODLEIAN LIBRARY**

A tour of the **Old Bodleian Library** allows visitors to see inside its historic rooms including the 15th-century Divinity School, medieval Duke Humfrey's Library, and the impressive Radcliffe Camera.





## OXFORD - BLENHEIM PALACE



**30 MINS** 

This morning, catch a bus to Blenheim Palace (buses leave every 30 minutes from Oxford train station) and spend the first part of your day exploring Britain's greatest Palace, also the birthplace of Sir Winston Churchill.

Make your way back to Oxford for the afternoon, stopping off to enjoy lunch, then visit Bodleian Library – the main research library of the University of Oxford, and one of the oldest libraries in Europe. Time permitting, why not stop off at Oxford Castle & Prison for an interactive, guided tour?



The Palace State Rooms – explore the gilded State Rooms at Blenheim Palace with their priceless collections of portraits, tapestries and furniture.



Bodleian Library — Duke Humfrey's Library was used as the Hogwarts library and the Divinity School as the infirmary in the Harry Potter movies

# HIGHLIGHTS


#### **CASTLE WALLS**

Wander down Friar Street with its black and white buildings and quaint cobbled streets. Discover museums and National Trust gardens and at the bottom, you'll see Edgar Tower, the last remaining part of the Castle Walls.

### **WORCESTER CATHEDRAL**

The dramatic Worcester Cathedral rises above the city landscape along the banks of the River Severn, with magnificent views over Worcestershire from the top of the tower





# **OXFORD - WORCESTER**



1 HR 15 MINS

Board a train at Oxford to travel to **Worcester** – one of the oldest cities in England with evidence of settlements here dating back to 700BC.

Upon arrival in Worcester, your day of discovery begins at The Commandery Encounter – a beautiful Grade 1 listed building with an 800-year history. Check out the beautifully dramatic Worcester Cathedral, the remains of the Castle Walls and not forgetting to sample some piquant Worcestershire Sauce!



Royal Tombs at Worcester Cathedral; the most notorious is 'bad' King John, famed for signing Magna Carta over 800 years ago.



Be sure to plan time to experience the stunning choral evening song at Worcester Cathedral

# HIGHLIGHTS

#### ANNE HATHAWAY'S HOUSE

Visit Anne Hathaway's Cottage, the beautiful 500 year old cottage where Shakespeare courted his bride-to-be. See original furniture including the Hathaway bed and uncover five centuries of stories in this picturesque cottage and 13 generations of the family who lived there

# SHAKESPEARE'S SCHOOLROOM & GUILDHALL

See where **W**illiam Shakespeare spent his schooldays, discovered theatre for the first time and was educated and inspired to become the world's greatest playwright.





## STRATFORD-UPON-AVON



2 HRS

Begin your day with a visit to Shakespeare's Birthplace – a restored 16th–century half–timbered house William Shakespeare was born in 1564 and spent his childhood years. Spend the afternoon exploring this town further, with a visit to Anne Hathaway's House

Spend the afternoon your own way, using your Hop On /
Hop Off Stratford Bus pass - a great way to get around and
explore on your own!

Finish the day with a pre-theatre dinner at the RSC Rooftop Restaurant followed by a play at the world-famous Royal Shakespeare Theatre

Warwick Castle is a medieval castle developed from a wooden fort, originally built by William the Conqueror in 1068. Warwick is the county town of Warwickshire, England, situated on a bend of the River Avon. The original wooden motte-and-bailey castle was rebuilt in stone in the 12th century.
